Message from the President - John McHardy

Once the conditions finally got right for the snowmobile season to start there were two days of +11° C and rain melting most of the snow. I am not totally alone "back in the bush" (4 km from the car) as I have occasionally seen fox tracks on the back deck and wolf tracks on the beach. Wiarton Willy has forecast an early spring so before we know it will be time to reopen the cottage and another summer season will begin.

The current list of KLCA activities includes:

- Tracking a broad range of topics of interest to the membership and keeping everyone informed through our web site (<u>www.klca.org</u>), this newsletter and our iconic "Reflections" annual publication
- Organizing and hosting our famous annual Regatta
- Monitoring our water quality through regular sampling and involvement with programs such as Lake Partners
- Active participation with MNR on fisheries and Kawagama and Bear Lake sonar mapping
- Representation with MNR on lake levels and forestry issues
- Modernization and operation of our lake navigation system
- Active involvement with organizations such as FOCA and CHA (Coalition of Haliburton Property Owners Association) to keep KLCA members abreast of the latest municipal, county and provincial waterfront property owners' concerns and activities
- Representing our members at local township and county meetings

All of what we do is only made possible through the efforts of volunteers. Some volunteer for one specific event such as the ever popular and successful Annual Regatta. This event typically requires approximately 50 volunteers to assist in the setup, running the numerous events and the tear down. I am sure the 400 or so who attend enjoy themselves and appreciate these efforts.

Others volunteer their time throughout the year traveling around the lake taking water quality samples; deploying the navigation aids in the early spring, monitoring their status throughout the year and returning them to storage in the late fall. We are always looking for new volunteers to lend a hand – in particular we are looking for someone to replace Andy Gort who after 4 years as Treasurer has decided it is time to let someone else have a turn. Andy has done an excellent job managing our finances and leaves the KLCA in a very healthy financial position. Another long time Director, Jennifer Gilland, has determined it is time for her to hand over her role as Director. Fisheries to someone else. *If vou* are. or know of anyone who is, interested in getting actively involved with the KLCA please email me via info@klca.org.

There are some news items you might be interested in:

- 1. The Ministry of Natural Resources ("MNR") is reviewing the business process looking to streamline their operations and reduce costs to meet budget reductions. One area of concern deals with work permits for certain types of shoreline alterations. The MNR is proposing to eliminate the requirement to obtain work permits before work is undertaken. It is important to understand that all current regulations would remain in effect – only the requirement for a work permit would be eliminated. A comment opposing this was submitted to the MNR on your behalf. The full comment can be found on the KLCA web site www.klca.org.
- Bell Mobility is working to erect a tower on the south shore of the lake to improve cell coverage which would also improve

access to the internet. Our preference is that the tower would be in the form of a "Tree Tower". While these are taller than the surrounding trees they really do blend in quite well. We are tracking this closely and will keep you updated.

- 3. Highlands Internet Services has received approvals to add antennas on the Dorset Tower which could improve their coverage area and provide improved internet access to more customers.
- 4. One of our top priorities for this year will involve septic tanks. We are assembling information packages and have engaged a leading industry expert (Rob Davis) to provide a talk on the care and feeding of septic tanks at our next <u>Annual General</u> <u>Meeting (AGM) July 6th, Dorset</u> <u>Community Centre.</u> We are also working with the townships to enable mandatory septic inspection.
- 5. The labour involved in the distribution of our annual publication Reflections was consuming too much of our scarce volunteer resources and the Board has determined, after reviewing a number of options, the best way to deal with this is to have the printer mail Reflections to you. Our goal is to have this mailed to you in time for the May long weekend. Membership renewal costs will be \$45.00 which represents a modest increase to cover the postage costs.

It has finally come. Those of us "outliers" who are boat access on Kawagama Lake have for the most part closed up our cottages for another season and I for one can't wait until there is enough ice to get back to Long Island by snow machine. Come on deep freezing nights and



sunny snowy days! I spent the weekend on November 10/11 in a mildly depressed state with my great pal and fellow cottager Tony

Frank, performing the mundane tasks associated with closing our cottages: final clean out, draining the water, stripping and pulling docks and cleaning out my work shop. It is literally "spring in" and "fall out" and little maintenance in between. This combined with the fact that the new markers are very robust makes for a much smoother management and logistical experience!

We are looking for volunteers around the lake who would be willing to participate in dropping a marker or two in the water in the spring and pulling them out and storing them under your cottage in the fall.
